The Drug Enforcement Administration has scheduled the 24th National Prescription Drug Take Back Day for April 22, 2023. The most recent take back day on October 29, 2022, brought in more than 647,000 pounds of unneeded medications across the country.

The upcoming take back day is an opportunity for the entire campus community, including students, faculty, staff, and neighbors, to bring unused, unneeded, or expired prescription drugs to authorized collection sites for proper disposal.

DEA, the International Association of Campus Law Enforcement Administrators, and NASPA—Student Affairs Administrators in Higher Education hope you will join us in this effort by encouraging your campus to participate in the upcoming National Prescription Drug Take Back Day. Collection sites staffed by authorized law enforcement officials are open from 10:00 a.m. to 2:00 p.m. (local time).
